### ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE (ARC)

REMINDER: <u>ALL</u> exterior changes need prior approval from the ARC and the WMC Board of Directors. This applies to <u>ALL</u> residents in Wind Meadows.

How do I start this process?

An "ARC" change application form is available on the WMC website windmeadows.org or you can contact the WMC office at wmc@w-p-inc.com. Change applications should include details of the exterior change, including pictures if possible. The application can be emailed, mailed, or hand delivered to the main WMC office at 6939 Mariner Drive, Racine, WI 53406. ARC meetings are held as needed with final approval during the Board meeting, typically held on the third Monday of every month. Requests are due 15 days prior to the Board meeting. After approval, it is the homeowner's responsibility to obtain any necessary building permits required by the Village of Wind Point and/or call Diggers Hotline depending on the scope of the project.

# JOHN'S DISPOSAL SERVICE, INC.

Per the Wind Meadows Guidelines, Rules and Regulations, all trash must be in a secure and sanitary container and may not be placed outside earlier than 6:00 p.m. the night before scheduled pickup. Garbage cans must be stored out of sight the same day following pickup. Recycling collection and Yard Waste pickup is every other Monday unless the Monday is a holiday. April recycling dates are **April 4th and 18th.** P.S. I am sorry these dates were not updated in the March newsletter.

### DOG WASTE

This is a reminder that all dog waste should be picked up immediately by the owner or responsible person walking the dog. Please leave your home with your dog AND a bag to pick up any dog waste as soon as your dog is done taking care of business. I have included the Wind Meadows Corporation (WMC) Guidelines, Rules and Regulations, Section 3(b) 1-3 which states what is expected of Wind Meadows residents, and I have included the Village of Wind Point ordinance, Chapter 4, Article II, Sec.1-41 which states what is expected of residents of the Village of Wind Point regarding dog waste and other.

Wind Meadows:

(1). Owners shall assume full responsibility for any damage to persons or property caused by his or her pet.

(2). Pets must be leashed and must not be walked or allowed on other Owners' private property.

(3). The pet owner is required to properly dispose of the waste his or her animal deposits on the Corporation property.



Village of Wind Point:

(a) It is unlawful for any person in immediate control of any dog to permit fecal matter which is deposited by such dog while off its own premises to remain on any street, lawn, field, or any public property. It is solely the responsibility of the person in control of the dog to immediately, after deposit, remove all fecal matter and dispose of the same.

(b) Any person owning or having control of a dog on any property, public or private, which is not owned or occupied by such person shall promptly remove excrement left by such dog and place it in a proper receptacle, bury it or flush it in a toilet on property owned or occupied by such person.

(c) Any person causing or permitting a dog to be on any property, public or private, not owned or occupied by such person shall have in his immediate possession a device or object suitable for removal of excrement and a depository for the transmission of excrement to the property owned or occupied by such person.

### BRANCH COLLECTION

Wind Point Public Works collects branches from residents for disposal on the second Tuesday of each month, **from <u>April to November</u>**. Branch piles do not require a yard waste sticker to be collected. In order to provide this service efficiently, the following rules apply:

 Branch collection is for tree maintenance (trimming branches) NOT tree removal. Property owners who have landscapers or other individuals cut down trees on their property are responsible for branch disposal.
Branches should not exceed 4 inches in diameter. Branches should be kept at their original length and not cut into smaller pieces.

3. Branches should be placed by the road in small, reasonably uniform piles. Piles should not exceed 4 feet in height and 4 feet in width. Pile branches with the cut end toward the road, all in the same direction. 4. Branch piles should be set out near the edge of the road away from mailboxes or other obstructions. Piles should be set out no earlier than the Saturday before collection day (72 hours). Piles set out too early or late can be tagged with a notice indicating the resident has 48 hours to remove the items. Tags will be noted with the date and time that they were placed. If branches are not removed within 48 hours as stated on the tag, a special collection will be arranged with Johns Disposal and the resident will be charged. 5. Stumps, vines, root balls, roots, rocks, brush, rubbish, construction material or metal will not be collected.

### WILD GARLIC MUSTARD

Please start pulling as soon as you see it growing. The garlic mustard around your homes and in the common wooded areas is quite severe. The best way to control this obnoxious invasive weed is to pull it out. Pulling it in the spring while the ground is soft will be much easier to get the entire plant, including the root. Each plant can release hundreds of seeds when mature, and it spreads fast.

After pulling, put it in a black plastic bag, labeled "GARLIC MUSTARD" and put it out with the garbage any Monday morning. **DO NOT LEAVE IT ALONG THE ROADSIDE UNBAGGED.** 

#### WINTER HOLIDAY DECORATIONS

It is well past the time to store your winter holiday decorations. Please remove holiday decorations per the WM Guidelines, Rules and Regulations; all decorations should be removed by January 15th of each year.

### CALL OR CLICK BEFORE YOU DIG

State law requires you to contact Diggers Hotline before you dig. To prevent a hazardous situation while digging, contact your local one-call system at least three (3) business days before you plan to dig. To schedule a locate, call 811 or go to diggershotline.com. Utilityowned underground facilities will be marked for free. Failure to call may result in penalties or fines.

### HOT SHOP GLASS, RACINE

Racine has a history of glass blowing. The Prairie School established a hot glass shop as part of its art department in 1969. In 2005, a growing community of glass blowing artists collaborated to establish a glass blowing studio and gallery. Dilapidated stables in downtown Racine were restored for the purpose. Tours and instruction are available for groups and individuals. In two hours trainees can learn to make a paperweight or ornament. There are seasonal classes, such as making hearts for Valentines Day and pumpkins for Halloween. Studios are rented by the hour and the artists' work is for sale in the gallery.

# **OPEN FIRES-RULES FOR SINGLE FAMILY HOMES**

Controlled outdoor fires for cooking, ceremonies, and recreation are permitted.

Controlled burning of yard material is allowed between the hours of Noon and 7pm.

The fires must be at least 10 feet from the property line and may not burn wet, combustible rubbish, garbage, oily substances, asphalt, plastic, rubber products or other material which creates dense smoke or cause a nuisance. The Village encourages residents to take advantage of the yard waste collection service as an alternative to burning yard waste.

## **RAIN BARREL INFORMATION**

Single Family Homes: Rain barrels are permitted only with prior approval from the ARC.

Patio, Manor, Garden, Village, and Prairie Meadow Homes:



Rain barrels are NOT permitted.

## VEGETABLE GARDENS

Single Family Homes: Vegetable gardens are permitted in the deeded lot in the backyard, not to exceed 80 square feet. If framing is used, 4x4 treated wood can be used; no fencing or railroad ties are allowed. Gardens must be kept neat at all times.

Patio, Manor, Garden, Village, and Prairie Meadow Homes: Vegetable gardens are NOT permitted.
