

VILLAGE OF WIND POINT PERMITS

A permit is required for a variety of building, electrical, plumbing, and heating/ventilation/air-conditioning projects. Please use this link to read about Village permits https://windpoint.org/departments/building_zoning/building_permits.php

Please note that although contractors are usually hired to complete the work, it is ultimately the homeowner’s responsibility to ensure that permits were properly obtained prior to starting the work. The fees are doubled for permits obtained after work has started; work conducted without permits may be subject to forfeiture. Download permit applications on the [Licenses & Permits](#) page. Submit applications and fees to the Village Office at 215 E. Four Mile Rd., Racine, WI 53402. A stamped, addressed envelope must be included with mailed submissions for return of your permit placard. When work is complete, contact the inspector to schedule the inspection.

VILLAGE OF WIND POINT ELECTION

The Spring General Election is on Tuesday, April 7. The polls for the Village of Wind Point will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Wind Point Public Works Garage, 215 E. Four Mile Road.

In-Person Absentee Voting

Voters can vote “In-Person Absentee” at the Village Office, 215 E. Four Mile Road from March 24 to April 3 during regular business hours. Please remember to bring a valid photo ID when coming to vote.

Mailed Absentee Ballot

You may request an absentee ballot online at [My Vote Wisconsin](#), and a ballot will be mailed to you. However, when making the request, please remember to account for mail transit time. Your ballot must be returned to the Village no later than **8:00 p.m. on April 7 in order to be counted**. If you received your mailed ballot and are unsure that it will be able to arrive by Election Day via the mail, you may drop it off at the following locations: Village Office, Village Office dropbox, at the Polls from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on April 7th.

Registering to Vote

You can check your registration status by going to [My Vote Wisconsin](#). If you need to register to vote, you can do so at the Village Office. You may also register at the polls on Election Day. When registering to vote, please remember to bring a copy of an appropriate document to verify your Wind Point residency.

WILD GARLIC MUSTARD

Please start pulling as soon as you see it growing. The garlic mustard around your homes and in the common wooded areas is quite severe. The best way to control this obnoxious invasive weed is to pull it out. Pulling it in the spring while the ground is soft will be much easier to get the entire plant, including the root. Each plant can release hundreds of seeds when mature, and it spreads fast. After pulling, put it in a black plastic bag, labeled “GARLIC MUSTARD” and put it out with the garbage any Monday morning.

DO NOT LEAVE IT ALONG THE ROADSIDE UNBAGGED.

What is Household Hazardous Waste?

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) are products used in your house, home garage, or residential garden/yard that can be flammable, corrosive, toxic and harmful to you and the environment if they are not handled properly.

How do you identify HHW Products?

Read the product label. If the product label contains any of the following words, then the product is hazardous:

- Toxic
- Flammable
- Corrosive/Caustic
- Reactive
- Poison
- Volatile Inflammable
- Combustible
- Explosive/Reactive
- Danger
- Caution
- Warning
- Harmful Solvents (item contains)

Why Should I Be Concerned?

Improper disposal of hazardous products such as pouring them down the drain, on the ground, into storm sewers, or placing them in the trash pollutes our environment and poses a threat to human & animal health.

Why does HHW require special handling/disposal?

Certain types of HHW have the potential to cause physical injury to sanitation workers, contaminate septic tanks or wastewater treatment systems. They can also present hazards to children and pets.

Where are the HHW Collection Events Held?

Only those that reside in the City of Racine (zip codes 53401-53408) and Villages of Caledonia, Elmwood Park, Mount Pleasant, North Bay, Sturtevant and Wind Point may participate. Racine Wastewater Utility's HHW Collection Events are located at: 6200 21st Street, Racine



If you reside outside the utility service area, please contact your Village or Town Hall for disposal options in your area.
