POOL AND TENNIS/PICKLEBALL COURT

Pool: The pool season is coming to an end with the pool closing the day after Labor Day. Thanks to all for a great, stress-free season!

Tennis/Pickleball Courts: The tennis courts will remain open until October 15th. Sadly, Tennis court 1 and 3 are already closed for the season for safety reasons.

Friendly reminders:

1. If you see that the garbage can on the court post is full on your court, please take a minute to empty it into the garbage dumpster outside of the gate.
2. If you invite guests, please be sure that they drop their \$3 guest fee in the box or scan the QR code to make this payment at the gate. If you owe the guest box money, please catch up this month. This money helps support the maintenance, supplies, and reservation systems costs.
3. Players please know that your enthusiasm brings joy and the sound of summer play to all BUT it also carries quite clearly to the homes that share the courts as their backyards. Please do your best to refrain from using foul language and/or from shouting at fellow players. Keep your fun to a low roar and enjoy!

REMINDER: POLITICAL SIGNAGE (reminders until we get it right)

Political signage is starting to pop up in the neighborhood. Please read the signage rules for Wind Meadows. **COMMON AREA SIGN PLACEMENT is NOT PERMITTED!**

(If you have placed a sign in common area, please remove it or it will be removed and disposed of. Thank you.)

Political Endorsement Signs

a. Manor, Patio, Village, Garden, and Prairie Meadow Homes. No political endorsement signs may be placed on common areas owned by WMC, including front common areas. One political endorsement sign per home no larger than 432 square inches (example: 18" x 24") may be placed inside the homeowner's property.

b. Single Family Homes. One political endorsement sign per home no larger than 432 square inches (example: 18" x 24") may be placed outside on the homeowner's property.

c. The period during which the sign can be put in place is: **beginning the first day the nomination papers are circulated by candidates and ending twenty-four (24) hours after the Election Day;** in the case of a referendum, beginning the day on which the question to be voted upon is submitted to the electorate and ending twenty-four (24) hours after the day on which the referendum is held.

ADVERTISE IN THE NEWSLETTER

The Board approved a quarterly advertising fee of \$40 for up to a half page space in the Wind Meadows monthly newsletter.

All ads are paid advertisements. Services are not necessarily endorsed by the WMC.

Wind Point Public Works collects branches from residents for disposal on **the second Tuesday of April, June, August, and OCTOBER**. Branch pick-up does not include leaves, weeds, and other yard waste.

Johns Disposal Service will pick up securely bundled yard waste, including brush that is no more than 50lbs, or 4ft long, or 6in in total bundled diameter. This service is available every other week beginning April 1, through the end of November. For information about yard waste collection please [click here](#).

In order to provide this service efficiently, the following rules apply:

1. Branch collection is for tree maintenance (trimming branches) NOT tree removal. Property owners who have landscapers or other individuals cut down trees on their property are responsible for branch disposal.
2. Branches should not exceed 4 inches in diameter. Branches should be kept at their original length and not cut into smaller pieces.
3. Branches should be placed by the road in small, reasonably uniform piles. Piles should not exceed 4 feet in height and 4 feet in width. Pile branches with the cut end toward the road, all in the same direction.
4. Branch piles should be set out near the edge of the road away from mailboxes or other obstructions. Piles should be set out no earlier than the Saturday before collection day (72 hours). Piles set out too early or late can be tagged with a notice indicating the resident has 48 hours to remove the items. Tags will be noted with the date and time that they were placed. If branches are not removed within 48 hours as stated on the tag, a special collection will be arranged with Johns Disposal and the resident will be charged.
5. Stumps, vines, root balls, roots, rocks, brush, rubbish, construction material or metal will not be collected.
6. If collection cannot be completed on a given day, the remainder of the route will be completed the next work day (s). To maintain scheduled operations, we cannot "backtrack" to collect branches set out late.

Household Hazardous Waste

What is Household Hazardous Waste?

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) are products used in your house, home garage, or residential garden/yard that can be flammable, corrosive, toxic and harmful to you and the environment if they are not handled properly.

How do you identify HHW Products?

Read the product label. If the product label contains any of the following words, then the product is hazardous:

Why Should I Be Concerned?

Improper disposal of hazardous products such as pouring them down the drain, on the ground, into storm sewers, or placing them in the trash pollutes our environment and poses a threat to human & animal health.

Why does HHW require special handling/disposal?

Certain types of HHW have the potential to cause physical injury to sanitation workers, contaminate septic tanks or wastewater treatment systems. They can also present hazards to children and pets.

Where are the HHW Collection Events Held?

Only those that reside in the City of Racine (zip codes 53401-53408) and Villages of Caledonia, Elmwood Park, Mount Pleasant, North Bay, Sturtevant and Wind Point may participate. Racine Wastewater Utility's HHW Collection Events are located at: 6200 21st Street, Racine



If you reside outside the utility service area, please contact your Village or Town Hall for disposal options in your area.
